NICU2HOME provides:

- · Parent education to understand the unique development of premature babies.
- Education on baby's cues and regulation.
- Support, education and information on feeding, sleeping, safety and medical conditions.
- Referrals to services, such as respite care (short-term) breaks for caregivers), infant massage therapy, mental health, occupational therapists or any others that may be necessary.
- · Connections to community groups for peer support and assistance.
- · Assistance with medical insurance, Social Security Disability (SSDI)/Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and other funding opportunities.









These services are FREE of charge. No diagnoses or medical conditions are required. This is a parent/guardian driven program focused on the family's goals, so parents and their care coordinator decide where to meet and what to work on. Families and care coordinators usually meet once a month with phone check-ins as needed.
